Made in God's image and likeness: in your diversity, you are cherished

Young people in the UK are living in a context where questions around sexuality and identity are very freely spoken about. Drawing from all the wisdom and teachings of the Catholic Church, how do we help them navigate these questions, especially within our Confirmation groups.

Using the principles of accompaniment, and listening with love, Fr Dominic offers some pathways for catechists, especially in situations where young people we are catechising identify as LGBT+.

A version of this workshop has already been presented in two of our secondary schools; it focuses on where our starting points can be, and also shows resources developed for schools (that could be adapted for parishes) developed by the BCYS, Brentwood Diocesan Education Service and the Department for Marriage and Family Life.
